

Each term your child will be given an attitude to learning assessment that are made by their class teachers on a scale of 1-4.

Attitude to Learning grade 4. Serious Concerns - Any of the following statements apply to the student:

- The student frequently disturbs the learning of other students.
- The student frequently refuses to follow teacher instructions.
- The student is frequently rude or disrespectful towards staff and other students.

Attitude to Learning grade 3. Requires Improvement - One or more of the following statements apply to the student:

- The student does not always follow teacher instructions.
- The student does not always make enough effort with classwork and homework, is not able to work independently and has missed deadlines.
- The student does not always take enough notice of advice being given by the teacher about how to improve their work.
- The student does not make enough contributions to classroom discussions.
- · The student does not concentrate and focus well enough in class.
- The student does not attend well, can be late and does not always bring the correct equipment.

Attitude to Learning grade 2. Good - All of the following statements apply:

- The student always follows teacher instructions.
- The student usually puts full effort into classwork and homework, is able to work independently and meets all deadlines.
- The student usually takes note and acts upon advice being given by the teacher about how to improve work.
- The student usually takes an active role in classroom discussions.
- The student usually concentrates well in class and is usually fully engaged.
- · The student always attends well, is punctual and brings equipment.

Attitude to Learning grade 1. Outstanding - The student meets all the criteria for Good PLUS at least one of the other three statements.

- The student is on track to make the progress required to meet their target at the end of Year 11.
- The student willingly helps others in the class.
- The students' classwork or homework is exceptional.
- The student regularly "goes the extra mile" to maximize their progress.
